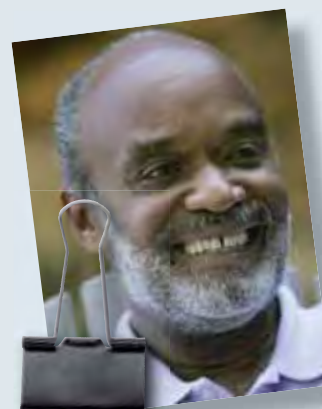

While it is known that primary education is not free, there is insufficient data to evaluate the real conditions of the education offer in this country.
