Teacher's Remarks:

Amando tries hard with a relatively high expenditure on education but his efforts aren't yet showing the desired results, perhaps because he has such a long way to climb after a history of conflict. Despite efforts to increase enrolments, the future for primary-aged children is very insecure, due to a very low completion ratio. Secondary schooling is out of reach for 93% of the population. Illiteracy is also a major concern for over two-thirds of the adult population. More encouraging is the strong growth in the primary access level and the related generous share of the education budget devoted to this sector. Amado could use some help from his better-off classmates in Europe and North America here - he has been waiting since 2002 when he joined the Fast Track Initiative!
